In fact, employment of LPNs is expected to grow 14 percent from now to 2016 due to the general increase in demand for health care services, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. A projected nursing shortage is expected to grow to 260,000 by 2025.

The dilemma, though, is that while there are many willing candidates for this specialized training, they find the waiting lists daunting. U.S.-based nursing schools turn away qualified applicants due to lack of faculty, clinical sites, classroom space or money.

Nursing Career Connections hopes to hold the key to this problem and bridge the gap between the nursing student and the school.

With public educational facilities offering only very limited seating per semester for nursing programs and private educational facilities offering seats at a very costly entrance, NCC is bridging the gap between the school and the student by providing for a unique nine-month online LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse) curriculum, followed by a four-month clinical study program abroad.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor is projecting between a 20 to 35 per cent growth in the next ten years due to longer life expectancies and a growing elder population.

The average income for LPNs in the central gulf coast area is about \$39,000 per year with salaries starting at \$32,500, according to the labor market Statistics by the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation. NCC is licensed in the State of Florida through the Department of Education
